Funding commitments from all three levels of government is needed to trigger construction of Phase One.

Phase One is the construction of an adjoining new building with new venues necessary to meet growing market demand and community aspirations.

Phase Two is the revitalization of the existing facility that will address \$71M in lifecycle challenges, and elevate the public's experience through upgraded amenities and technology.

NOW is the time to invest in ACT to serve the needs of our growing and changing community.

After a successful pilot year, we're excited to kick off the RBC Emerging Visual Artists Program at Arts Commons, which will elevate local artists through mentorship, workshops, and public exhibitions in our galleries. This year we'll support more than 75 artists in our spaces – all paid for their work and time.

Imbued with a soul-stirring stage presence beyond his years, 22 year-old Jontavious Willis has being hailed as a modern Wunderkind and a true blues prodigy. The young Georgian has been taken under the wing of blues greats like Taj Mahal and Keb' Mo, playing main stages across North America – when he's not in class at Columbus State University, that is.

Willis grew up singing gospel music with his grandfather, until he came across a Youtube clip of Muddy Waters playing *Hoochie Coochie Man* and immediately fell in love with the blues. He taught himself guitar, harmonica, and banjo – and was playing on Taj Mahal's stage by the age of 18.




