

Elizabeth Bougerol and Evan Palazzo have been asked numerous times where the catchy name of their band came from. Would you guess...the grocery store?

"We just wanted to play this music for fun...We just needed a band name to put on the sheet," says Bougerol. "The jazz we were really digging into was sort of from the '20s and it was known as hot jazz. So, we wanted 'hot' in the name. And then I literally saw a tin of sardines in hot sauce at the supermarket, and I said to Evan, 'What do you think?' And he was like, 'Sounds good to me.'"





The United Nations of bands, Pink Martini features a dozen musicians with songs performed in 25 different languages. They draw inspiration from Latin music, jazz, cabaret, and even film scores for a sound that defies categorization.

Lauded and applauded around the world for the past 25 years. Pink Martini started out as a house band for parties helping with progressive causes like affordable housing, public broadcasting, libraries, music education, and the environment. The first concert they ever played together happened guite by accident when the band that pianist Thomas Lauderdale had hoped to line-up for a fundraising concert didn't show. So he threw on a cocktail dress, grabbed a bass player, bongo player, and singer, and took the stage as Pink Martini. That was in 1994, and they've been going strong since, playing fun, upbeat music for people who want to have fun and expanding their membership from four people to twelve!

About performing in Canada, Thomas says, "Our time in Canada has always been great because the audiences are totally boisterous and on fire. It's like America but more earnest and less self-conscious."



If you were to say to Delvon Lamarr that the organ is an outdated instrument, he would tell you, "You're sadly mistaken.

The thing about the organ is that it's in a lot of music you listen to, you just don't realize it. A lot of cats use digital keyboards to recreate it, but the sound it just about everywhere. I love the sound and the personality of it. It's a very expressive instrument. You can make it sound like pretty much whatever you want it to sound like."

Performing with an organ isn't easy though.
Unlike a guitar or keyboard, you can't take
it on a plane. This means that Delvon is
very used to driving to gigs – all over the
continental United States. "We've pretty
much been in every single State in the
United States of America as well as Montreal,
Vancouver, Victoria, Toronto...and this is our
first time in Calgary."

Calgary's own local blues legend, Tim Williams is a 40-year veteran of the roots music scene across North America. Williams has played festivals, folk clubs, concert halls, and roadhouses from Morocco to Australia, and through the Yukon and Mexico.

The hometown hero has been inducted to the Hall of Fame by the Calgary Blues Music Association, won the 2017 YYC Music Award for Blues Recording of the Year, and earned five Betty Mitchell Awards for composition and musical direction in theatre.

He's also won the International Blues Challenge in Memphis, and earned a string of Maple Blues Award nominations.



Backed into a corner by a bad deal with a big record label, Petty actually threatened to shelve his third album with the Heartbreakers. Lucky for us, the label settled and Damn the Torpedoes was released in 1979, eventually selling triple-platinum. Rolling Stone declared it the Tom Petty album "we've all been waiting for." The album sat at number two on the Billboard albums chart for seven weeks, cementing it as one of the great records of the album rock era.

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Zoltan Takacs:

Deadliest Lifesavers

Biomedical scientist and inventor Zoltan Takacs collects snake, scorpion, jellyfish, and other venoms from around the world. Back in the lab, using cutting-edge genomics, he creates combinatorial venom libraries to identify leads for novel medicines.

Driven by his childhood passion, he's travelled to 155 countries and become an aircraft pilot. scuba diver, and real-life survivor, roughing it in a hammock deep in the Amazon or in remote Pacific islands. He's survived charging elephants, pirated waters, a series of snake bites, and venom spit in his face (all his fault he admits). Now he's allergic to both snake venom and anti-venom.

Seeking out lifesaving toxins

National Geographic Explorer and viper It is the precise nature of this ability that enthusiast Zoltan Takacs grew up in makes them so useful in pharmaceuticals. Hungary and developed a fascination with "It's like a key would fit into a lock." snakes, keeping and breeding them through his youth. Now, as an adult, he seeks them out around the world, but for a more global and noble reason.

> "Animal venoms haven been evolving for hundreds of millions of years to immobilize and kill," says Zoltan. "But what makes these toxins so powerfully lethal, also can be used to make life saving medications."

> > By taking blood samples from a variety of venomous animals, Zoltan can build a diverse library, and from that library he can isolate the genetic blueprint for every single toxin. Venomous animals like rattlesnakes are immune to their own venom, and it's in that immunity that could be the key to a lifesaving medication for a human illness. Currently, two of the most commonly prescribed medications used to treat heart attacks are derived from

> > > snake venom.

"Animal toxins are excellent templates to design new medications," says Zoltan. "Animal toxins have evolved to latch on to the receptors of their victims' cells.

This is where Zoltan's passion for conservation comes in. Many of these toxic and venomous animals, particularly in the more unexplored parts of our planet, have never been studied let alone sampled. "If you let this natural beauty to be erased," Takacs told the crowd, "we're going to be erasing future potential medications."

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
















AC OUR LOCATION
