Heat Up Your November as The Harpoonist and The Axe Murderer Shred the Engineered Air Theatre with their Rocking Style of Blues

October 12, 2022 - CALGARY - JUNO-nominated and multi-Maple Blues Award-winners Shawn Hill and Matthew Rogers, a.k.a. The Harpoonist and The Axe Murderer, are ready to shake up the Engineered Air Theatre at Arts Commons. Known for their deep grooves, wailing harmonica riffs, and driving bluesy rhythms, this duo has firmly set themselves in Canadian hearts with sold-out performances coast to coast. Join Arts Commons Presents for The Harpoonist and The Axe Murderer as part of the 25th Anniversary PCL Blues season with Arts Commons Presents on Friday, November 4 & Saturday, November 5, 2022.

With five albums in 15 years, the upward trajectory of The Harpoonist and the Axe Murderer is clear. Each release breaks fresh ground, exploring new musical vocabularies. Their addictive blend of rock and blues, underpinned by Hall's distinctive tenor, has pulled from influences in soul, funk, and even electronica to shape each track. Their latest album, Live at the King Eddy, was recorded in Calgary's legendary venue on the Rolling Stones mobile studio that now resides at the National Music Centre. This same mobile studio recorded a staggering number of classic masterworks, including four Led Zeppelin albums, three by Deep Purple, and Who's Next by The Who. Hall and Matthew now join these illustrious musicians as the first Canadian band to be recorded by the mobile studio. And now, they're set to return to Calgary and share their time-tested sound with PCL Blues audiences.

"Playing a room like the Arts Commons is a gem for us, as it takes us away from our rowdier terrain and allows us to feature songs with more delicacy and vocal intimacy especially when we have singers like Andrina Turenne onboard for 2 nights," says Shawn Hall.
