ArtsXpeditions from Arts Commons Presents Launches 2022 Summer Festivities with National Indigenous Peoples Day and Canada Day Celebrations on Olympic Plaza

June 17, 2022 - CALGARY – Warm weather, sunny days, and ArtsXpeditions are back! This year we kick off the popular outdoor concert series on Tuesday, June 21 with a National Indigenous Peoples Day Mini Pow Wow, live on 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue outside the Centre Court of Arts Commons. ArtsXpeditions also makes a splash on Friday, July 1 for the City of Calgary's Canada Day celebrations on Olympic Plaza. These two events are the first forays in a city-spanning summer lineup for the third annual edition of the free, outdoor pop-up performance series from the programming arm of Arts Commons, Arts Commons Presents. Alanna Bluebird-Onespot, a self-published author, poet, and spoken word performer, is curator of the ArtsXpeditions National Indigenous Peoples Day event. Bluebird-Onespot's program of a Mini Pow Wow on the 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue just outside Centre Court of Arts Commons will feature traditional dances from Indigenous Nations from across Treaty 7, such as Grass Dance, Women and Men's Traditional, Chicken Dance, and more. Attendees of all cultural backgrounds are welcome and will learn simple steps during this intergenerational gathering of Indigenous artists and join an Intertribal Dance, meant to build relations and bring people from across ages, nations, and culture together.

"Pow Wows are a powerful showcase of traditional dances and songs that bring together generations to share joy and spiritual healing," says Bluebird-Onespot. "Art can heal us. It can inspire us. And it can connect us. We are all artists and we are all community. I hope that members of the Calgary community will join us, and we can take that opportunity share and learn from each other." Bringing people together for National Indigenous Peoples Day builds bridges and fosters relations between Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities in Calgary, a tradition that Arts Commons Presents is proud to be part of.

ArtsXpeditions makes its second appearance on **Friday**, **July 1**<sup>st</sup> as part of the City of Calgary's **Canada Day** festivities on **Olympic Plaza** from **11 a.m. – 5 p.m**. The event features six different performing artists, starting with Music by Mandy for kids and families, followed by Perpie Nwaefido, Walter MacDonald White Bear, Robert Adam and the Lucky Stars, Natalia Chai, and Sargeant x Comrade to round out the evening. The day is also free for the public to attend.

Energizing all four quadrants of the city with free outdoor music and family-friendly programming, ArtsXpeditions first launched in the summer of 2020 to continue to deliver the performing arts to Calgarians as well as provide vital employment to artists during the COVID-19 shutdown. By taking the performing arts beyond the walls of Arts Commons, ArtsXpeditions expands access and invites new audiences to experience the uplifting power of the arts. Since its launch, ArtsXpeditions has shared 114 performances employing 174 artists in parks, elderly care facilities, schoolyards, and outdoor gathering places across the city.

This summer, more live performances of music will pop up in all four quadrants of Calgary featuring exciting local names. As well, Arts Commons Presents is collaborating with the University of Calgary youth theatre group Wagonstage to bring storytelling and participatory art activities to parks and schoolyards for Calgarians of all

ages. More ArtsXpeditions acts, dates and times will be announced in the coming weeks at artscommons.ca/artsx.

"ArtsXpeditions is an incredible opportunity for Arts Commons to meet our audiences in our city's beautiful parks with some of our best local talent," says Josh Dalledonne, Assistant Director of Social Impact.
