Arts Commons Presents Brings Visually Stunning Stage Adaptation of Beloved Children's Books Comes to Calgary with Leonardo! A Wonderful Show About a Terrible Monster

May 2, 2023 - CALGARY — Setting a new bar in excellence for theatre for young audiences, Emmy Award-winning Manual Cinema and Arts Commons Presents bring a ground-breaking performance of *Leonardol A Wonderful Show About a Terrible Monster* to the Engineered Air Theatre at Arts Commons, May 26, 27 & 28.

Translating the whimsical art and heart-warming story of Mo Willems' classic books, Manual Cinema creates a moving picture book on stage. The performance collective achieves their unique look with a combination of vintage overhead projectors, multiple screens, puppets, actors, and live feed cameras, all interwoven to mind-bending effect. The characters jump off the page to the stage, further enhanced by onstage sound effects and an original score, all performed live by the Manual Cinema ensemble.

"We wanted to bring the same depth of storytelling and cinematic artistry that is in our adult work to this children's show. We have found that children are even more discerning and unlike adults will only give attention to the show if it has earned it and is engaging them!" Says Julia Miller, Co-Artistic Director of Manual Cinema and director of Leonardo! A Wonderful Show About a Terrible Monster. "I want the kids to see magic being made with simple supplies that they have at home, and I hope that they leave the show feeling like they can do it, too."

Acclaimed children's author and staple of every classroom library, Mo Willems is best known for his 25-volume series *Elephant and Piggie* which tackles relatable difficulties and anxieties of Elementary Schoolaged children in a light-hearted manner. *Leonardo! A Wonderful Show About a Terrible Monster* is based on *Leonardo, the Terrible Monster* and its sequel, *Sam, the Most Scaredy-Cat Kid in the Whole World.* It follows the story of Leonardo, a monster who can't seem to frighten anyone, no matter how hard he tries. One day he meets Sam, a little boy who is afraid of everything! Could this be Leonardo's chance to finally scare like a real monster, or will he discover a new friend?

Leonardo! A Wonderful Show About a Terrible Monster is presented as part of Arts ReimaginED, a new program from Arts Commons Education to support arts education in Calgary. To inspire families and children to engage with the show on a deeper level, attendees are invited to the Monster Lab to create their own monsters with designs created by celebrated PuppetStuff Canada creators, Brendan James Boyd and Reese Scott. Audience members can create their puppets to enjoy during the show or stop by after witnessing the inspiring creative techniques by Manual Cinema. Audience members are also invited to a post-show demonstration of the technology implemented by Manual Cinema to share their questions with cast and crew. They may even want to try some of the techniques out in their own puppet shows.

"You can feel the joy, passion, and creativity that Manual Cinema has poured into Leonardo! A Wonderful Show About a Terrible Monster," says Karen Youngberg, Associate Director of Education at Arts Commons. "We hope that audience members will be inspired by the technical techniques used in the storytelling and will want to play in our Monster Lab to explore their own stories! Who knows, perhaps the next

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puppeteer/storyteller/musician/creator of magical things will find their calling, here at Leonardo! A Wonderful Show About a Terrible Monster."

Manual Cinema is an Emmy Award-winning performance collective, design studio, and film/video production company founded in 2010 by Drew Dir, Sarah Fornace, Ben Kauffman, Julia Miller, and Kyle Vegter. Manual Cinema combines handmade shadow puppetry, cinematic techniques, and innovative sound and music to create immersive stories for stage and screen.

Using vintage overhead projectors, multiple screens, puppets, actors, live feed cameras, multi-channel sound design, and a live music ensemble, Manual Cinema transforms the experience of attending the cinema and imbues it with liveness, ingenuity, and theatricality. The company was awarded an Emmy in 2017 for *The Forger*, a video created for The New York Times and named Chicago Artists of the Year in 2018 by the Chicago Tribune. In 2020 they were included in 50 of Chicago theater "Rising Stars and Storefront Stalwarts" (Newcity). Their shadow puppet animations were

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featured in the 2021 film remake of Candyman, directed by Nia DaCosta and produced by Jordan Peele's Monkeypaw Productions.
