National Geographic Explorer Jasper Doest Shares the Power of Photography to Initiate Change by Sharing the Human Side of Wildlife

Just announced, National Geographic Explorer and photographer Jasper Doest to speak replacing the previously engaged Lucy Hawkes.

February 21, 2023 - CALGARY – Not many of us have had a face-to-face encounter with a wild Japanese macaque, or cradled a pink flamingo in our arms who is recovering from a near fatal concussion. This is the power of Jasper Doest's images – sharing an intimate moment with a creature who is not so different from ourselves. Dutch photographer Jasper Doest explores the beautiful and fragile relationship between humankind, wildlife, and our shared planet. Catch Jasper Doest: A Voice for Nature from National Geographic Live and Arts Commons Presents on Sunday, March 12 & Monday, March 13, 2023 in the Jack Singer Concert Hall at Arts Commons.

Award-winning photographer and National Geographic Live Explorer Jasper Doest strives through his work to give a voice to the wildlife with whom we share this planet. He creates visual stories that explore the relationship between humankind and nature—a critical subject as human impact on the planet increases. Doest looks to 'rewilding,' or creating more space for wildlife and natural processes, to forge a sustainable new balance between humans and the wilderness. He has photographed everything from elegant strokes standing in a landfill in Portugal, Spain where they pick through our garbage for food to Japanese macaques, or "snow monkeys," as they soaked in the local hot spring in Honshu, Japan. Whether in climates tropical or arctic, documenting birds, primates, or our own human impact, Doest's emotional images are an urgent reminder of the beauty and fragility of our planet.

"I've noticed there is a growing divide between ourselves and the natural world," says Doest. "My work is to make people care about all life that surrounds us. I try to do that in an engaging way where I try not to judge, but much rather ask questions about our connection with other species. Our planet needs sustainability. Photographers can give a voice to those who can't speak for themselves. Photographers can initiate change. That is the power of photography."

Arts Commons Presents has been bringing the wildly popular National Geographic Live series to Calgary for twelve seasons, engaging Calgarians' passions for science, exploration, and the natural world. Live at Arts Commons, speakers share their inspiring and often deeply personal stories of their work in the field with high-resolution images and video projected on a screen that runs the impressive 28-feet height and the 48-foot width of the Jack Singer Concert Hall stage. The presentations also have a strong education and community engagement component, inviting thousands of students each season to experience these speakers live in the Jack Singer Concert Hall.


