Take a Walk into the Bear's Den with Arts Commons Presents and National Geographic Live's Rae Wynn-Grant: The Secret Life of Bears

March 22, 2022 - CALGARY — As a scientist with the National Geographic Society's Last Wild Places Initiative, Dr. Rae Wynn-Grant works to protect and restore wildlife populations iconic to places like Calgary: grizzly bears, bison, pronghorn, cougars, and more. So she knows firsthand that when these animals intersect with human activity—like roads, fences, and cattle ranches that crisscross their habitats—the impacts on their survival are far-reaching. Next month, this committed carnivore ecologist will share a fascinating look inside the mission to help humans and bears coexist peacefully. Join us at the Jack Singer Concert Hall on Sunday, April 10 and Monday, April 11, 2022 as Arts Commons Presents and National Geographic Live bring Rae Wynn-Grant: The Secret Life of Bears to the stage.

Rae Wynn-Grant is dedicated to wildlife ecology research, but it wasn't until life brought her to Kenya at age 20 that she had ever taken a hike, pitched a tent to camp, or seen a wild animal. While there, she studied East African lions—top predators that live in close quarters with local communities—and observed that problematic interactions between the two groups that threatened conservation efforts.

Now, Dr. Wynn-Grant is finding similar patterns in North American black and grizzly bears. She studies the movements and behaviours of the bears to find ways to improve the relationship between local communities and the apex wildlife species that surround them.

"Two things are happening right now," says Rae Wynn-Grant. "The human population in North America is increasing, and the black bear population in North America is increasing. We're getting way more bears showing up to places where formerly there was forest, formerly there was high-quality habitat. It's creating a lot of conflict, but it's also creating a lot of opportunity for scientists like me to learn about coexistence. There's a science to human-wildlife coexistence, and that's what I'm trying to learn."

Arts Commons Presents has been bringing the wildly popular National Geographic Live series to Calgary for nine seasons, engaging Calgarians in a passion for science, exploration, and the natural world. Speakers share their inspiring and often deeply personal stories of their work in the field, live at Arts Commons, with high-resolution images and video projected on a screen that runs the impressive 48-foot width of the Jack Singer stage and 28 feet high. The presentations also have a strong education and community engagement component, inviting thousands of students each season to experience these speakers live in the Jack Singer Concert Hall, or virtually in their classroom. Working in collaboration with the Calgary Zoo, Joel Sartore added three species to his *Photo Ark Project*, including the greater sage grouse which exists in captivity no where else in the world.
