Live at the Jack Singers Concert Hall, Dr. Cooney will bring Calgarians into the misunderstood lives of female leaders in Ancient Egypt, from Nefertiti to Cleopatra and beyond; how they lived, held onto their power, and how they met their eventual end. In her research, she has examined society's hostility towards female rulers throughout history and what that means for our world today in how we view leadership and gender.

An accomplished and well-respected scholar, Kara Cooney has participated in digs with the Metropolitan Museum of New York at the Royal Pyramid complex of Senwosret III and the Theban Necropolis with Johns Hopkins University. She appeared as a lead expert in the popular Discovery Channel special *The Secrets of Egypt's Lost Queen* and is a recurring team member of the History Channel's *Digging for the Truth*. Her book *The Woman Who Would Be King: Hatshepsut's Ride to Power in Ancient Egypt* was published in 2014, and she also wrote *When Women Ruled the World: Six Queens of Egypt*, which was published by National Geographic in 2018.

"These women [Egyptian queens] were power brokers: educated for complex tasks and supreme leadership, ready to hold the highest position and able to see and move the pieces on the board," says Kara Cooney. "But viewed through another lens, they were utterly powerless, mere pawns of a patriarchal system over which they had no control and could never hope to alter in the long term."

Arts Commons Presents has been bringing the wildly popular National Geographic Live series to Calgary for eleven seasons, engaging Calgarians in a passion for science, exploration, and the natural world. Speakers share their inspiring and often deeply personal stories of their work in the field, live at Arts Commons, with high-resolution images and video projected on a screen that runs an impressive 48 feet across width of the Jack Singer stage. The presentations also have a strong education component, inviting thousands of students each season to experience these speakers live in the Jack Singer Concert Hall, or virtually in their classroom.
