## Arts Commons Presents Brings Live Jazz and Cartoons to the Jack Singer Concert Hall with The Queen's Cartoonists

January 5, 2023 - CALGARY – The Queen's Cartoonists are on a mission to make jazz fun and accessible for every music fan, young or old. And what better way to accomplish this than by bringing the jazzy soundtrack of our favourite cartoons to life? Join Arts Commons Presents for an evening of family friendly fun with The Queen's Cartoonists as part of our Jazz series in the Jack Singer Concert Hall on January 26, 2023.

The Queen's Cartoonists put a new spin on old classics by playfully combining jazz music, imaginative foley techniques, and light-hearted comedy to a backdrop of new and classic cartoons and animation for an evening of musical enjoyment. The band provides live accompaniment in front of a larger-than-life screen of animated classics, combining them with witty anecdotes that demonstrate the importance of music, particularly jazz, in film. The result is an evening of musical excellence as well as slapstick silliness for every jazz fans in your family. Praised by critics as "an incredible band with very tight precision," (Tillamook County Pioneer), The Queen's Cartoonists have delighted audiences worldwide and have even opened for the New York Philharmonic.

Founded in 2015 by band leader and pianist Joel Pierson, The Queens Cartoonists consists of six musicians who reside in the New York City borough of Queens (hence the name). On a mission to spread their love of cartoons and the music that accompanies them around the world, the group stops in Calgary as part of their 2022-23 world tour. This performance, which will include animations from the National Film Board of Canada's catalogue, showcases the music that made figures such as Betty Boop, Popeye, and the Pink Panther so darned memorable. By highlighting the ubiquity of jazz—that you can find it everywhere, even in a children's cartoon—The Queen's Cartoonists make this style of music accessible and fun for all ages.

"There's a lot of stigma against jazz and classical music. There's this sense of 'Oh, that's not for me' or 'It's too complicated' and I don't think that's true. I think we just need the right kind of exposure" says Joel Pierson of The Queen's Cartoonists. "You know, cartoons were created introducing classical music to people — everyone learned some Wagner and Rossini from Bugs Bunny and that kind of stuff. So I thought maybe I could do that with musicians and a band."

Arts Commons Presents' Jazz series has welcomed the best jazz performers from around the world. The 2021-22 season applauded New York's rising stars with Jazz at Lincoln Center: *Songs We Love* and made history with the world premiere of the Canadian National Jazz Orchestra. The current season now brings the The Queen's Cartoonists to the Jack Singer Concert Hall stage for an acclaimed performance merging joy, play, and jazz.

The rest of the **2022-23 season** of Jazz from Arts Commons Presents promises a lineup you won't want to miss, including one of the greatest living legends in jazz and funk history, <u>Booker T: *A Stax Revue*</u> on February 25, 2023 and a rising star with the <u>Joey Alexander Trio</u> on April 28, 2023.
